Tell us a bit about yourself

To kick start our new Willowbrook Spotlight on... feature, Lynsey Davies-Coward Registered Manager & Nominated Individual at Willowbrook Homecare agreed to answer a few get-to-know-me questions.





I am happily married with two young children. I have two cats who are my adored fur babies, and when I retire, I would like to add a little sausage dog called Frank to our family. I have worked in the care sector for nearly 13 years.

How did I get into care

I fell into it accidentally after graduating from university. I started working for Tunstall Lifeline, then I moved to Lancashire County Council, initially doing Adult and Children's Social Care referrals before moving to a role as Care Worker for a homecare provider.

Tell us about your career path

Throughout my career, I have progressed through many roles; Care Worker, Senior Carer, Field Care Supervisor, Care coordinator and Manager, and now Registered Manager and Nominated Individual. I studied whilst working full-time to obtain my Level 5 in Leadership and Management.

What's the best advice you have ever received

Do not expect people to do what you aren't willing to do yourself! I believe this has put me in good stead, and ultimately if I am needed to sit in reception, look at rotas or deliver care then that's what I will do.

I love the variety of my job role, as I get bored quickly and easily.

I also love hearing about all the war stories. I will be sad when that generation has gone because I feel that history books do not do that period of history any justice. I love finding out what makes people tick. I am a passionate advocate for the care sector to be recognised as equal to the NHS. We are professionals and masters at what we do.

Tell us a surprising fact about you

I have dyslexia and dyspraxia. People can find this surprising, especially in the role I have. It affects mainly my memory/concentration span, coordination and how long it takes me to read and understand written words. I often say to new staff and service users, please do not be offended if I cannot remember your name, but it takes me a while.

I usually have to word-associate, so for example, if your name is Wendy, I might remember that as Wendy Windmill!!!! It might sound silly to some, but that is how I get on in life.

Whilst having a learning disability can cause difficulties in some areas, it gives me strengths in other areas, like thinking outside the box and planning in advance.

I currently work part-time at Willowbrook whilst studying. I previously worked in dentistry for nine years, where I was very much involved with the recruitment process. Foodbank Fundraiser




Thank you to everyone who supported our fundraiser on Friday 25th November in aid of Union Road Community Church Foodbank

HOME FIRE SAFETY CHECK SERVICE

Did you know that you can receive your own personalised Home Fire Safety Advice by filling in a questionnaire on the Lancashire Fire and Rescue Service website?

Based on your answers they will either email you fire safety advice specific to your needs or they will contact you to arrange a home safety check visit.

If you have problems accessing the website, you can call 0800 169 1125.

If you have a hearing impairment you can text 07766831145.

If you have already received a Home Fire safety check from them and your smoke alarm has stopped working, contact Fire Angel on 08001412561 from Monday to Friday between 9 am-5pm, and they will arrange for a replacement smoke alarm to be delivered.

Equality for disabled people

PRIORITY SERVICE REGISTER

Priority Services Register for extra help from energy and water companies

You can sign up to a Priority Services Register (PSR) to receive extra help from your energy or water company. It's free to sign up.

You do not need to show proof of your condition, age or situation.

You're eligible if you:

- have reached your State Pension age
- are disabled or have a long-term medical condition
- are recovering from an injury
- have a hearing or sight condition
- have a mental health condition
- are pregnant or have children under 5
- have extra communication needs, such as if you do not speak or read English well


